No Jewellery Allowed!



England netball guidelines state that earrings are NOT permitted whilst training or playing netball and even taped earrings (new NOT piercings) are permitted as there is still a risk of a ball or another player contacting the ear during play and causing an injury. As a club, we strictly adhere to this rule. If you are intending to have your ears pierced and you still want to play netball, you might want to consider having them done at the start of the summer holidays or after the season has finished. Some of our players who have had their ears pierced in the past have had to miss training for a few weeks until they can remove the earrings. The only jewellery permitted by England netball is a wedding band (we don't see many of these at juniors!) or a medic alert bracelet, and both must be securely taped before play. Thank you for helping us stay a safe club.
